

STUDENT CONDUCT ON SCHOOL BUSES

Buses carrying school children will be considered extensions of the school. Any student whose conduct on a school bus is improper or jeopardizes the safety of other students may have his right to school bus transportation suspended for such period of time as the superintendent or his /her designee deems appropriate.

Consistent application of this policy will be enforced by the school principal or his or her designee so that for a:

- First offense: discipline will be administered by the principal and a warning letter sent to parents
- Second offense: the student will not be allowed to ride the bus for up to one (1) week and a parent conference with the principal is required
- Third offense: the student will not be allowed to ride the bus for up to two (2) weeks and a parent conference with the principal is required
- Fourth offense: parent and student conference with the principal and superintendent may result in the suspension of bus privileges for the remainder of the year
